### Rules Checklist

\*\*\*NOTE: a 6-credit course can be made up of two 3-credit courses.

**1. Residency requirement:** a minimum of 30 credits (5 full courses) including at least half (50 per cent) of the major credits must be completed at York University. **2. Faculty requirement** a minimum of 36 credits at the 3000 or 4000 level including 18 credits at the 4000 level. **3. Graduation requirement:** students must successfully complete (pass) at least 90 credits that meet the Faculty's degree and program requirements with a cumulative grade point average of at least 5.00 (C+).
