MINIMUM FACULTY DEGREE REQUIREMENTS <u>BACHELOR OF ARTS</u>

IMPORTANT NOTE: A Study Plan Checklist is an aid for planning courses only and should be used in conjunction with the calendar. It is NOT a substitute for the calendar. Degree and program requirements are subject to change. Every effort has been made to ensure that the study plan checklist and the York Undergraduate Calendar reflect the most recent changes. There may be instances when what is published does not reflect the most current University policy. In such instances, when the published versions of policies or regulations differ from what has been most recently approved by Senate, the latter will prevail. It is the responsibility of the student to take the correct courses and ensure ALL degree and program requirements are met.

Minimum academic standing for a BA bachelor degree: Cumulative grade point average 4.0.

General education requirements: 24 credits in accordance with the following to be completed at the 1000 level: six credits Humanities; six credits Natural Science; six credits Social Science and six credits Mathematics or Modes or Reasoning. Some programs require MATH 1710 6.00 as a general education requirement. Please refer to your program of study. General education courses DO NOT fulfil major or the degree requirement of courses required outside the major. No more than 30 general education credits will count towards a degree. (Exception: students who have successfully completed a nine credit 1000 level foundation course will be considered to have satisfied the six credit corresponding area of study in general education and three credits will count toward non-major or free choice courses.)

Major requirements: In accordance with major program requirements.

Required courses outside the major: At least 18 credits

Upper level requirements: Of the required 90 credits for the degree students must complete at least 24 credits at the 3000 level or above.

Residency requirement: At least 30 credits not used toward another academic program are to be taken at York University. Half the major credits must be taken through Atkinson.

Graduating with a BA bachelor degree: Students must pass at least 90 credits that meet Atkinson degree and program requirements. The cumulative grade point average (GPA) must be at least 4.0 for all courses.

Failure to maintain minimum academic standing: Advising is recommended

Students whose cumulative grade point average on at least 24 York credits is below 2.5 must withdraw for 12 months.

Students who have completed less than 90 credits who fall below the minimum cumulative grade point average of 4.0 will be placed on academic warning.

Students who have completed 90 credits and less than 102 credits, who do not have the required cumulative grade point average of 4.0, will be allowed additional credits to the maximum of 102 credits in an attempt to raise their grade point average for graduation.

Students who have completed 102 credits or greater, who do not have the minimum 4.0 cumulative grade point average will be ineligible to proceed or graduate.
